

**EMMET COUNTY
OPEN CLASS
BOTTLE/BUCKET LAMB
PROJECT**



Rules:

1. Open Class: Open to any exhibitor who lives in Emmet County and who has completed kindergarten through third grade at the time of the show.
2. Any orphan or newborn lamb, ewe or weather, lambed between Jan. 1st and May 15th of the current year may be shown. Exhibitor must pick up an ID sheet from the Extension office, fill it out and return it back into the Extension office or to Lynette Nitchals by May 15th. Lamb must be also ear tagged, with tag information on ID sheet, a picture of exhibitor with their lamb, lambs included with ID sheet.
3. Open Class will be required to fill out a Bottle Lamb Questionnaire to be turned in at their interview. The bottle lamb packet with questionnaire and ID sheet can be picked up at the Extension office or contacting Lynette Nitchals, or John Irmiter.
4. An exhibitor may identify up to 3 lambs, but is limited to only one that exhibits at fair. It is recommended that if no other livestock are on the premise, that they purchase two lambs for better survivability.
5. Lambs should be in possession of the exhibitor within one week of birth. Lambs must be bottle, or bucket fed. **NO NURSING PERMITTED.**
6. All lambs are to be halter broke and will be shown at halter.
7. Lambs must be free of any contagious or infections conditions.
8. Lambs must be slick sheared to be eligible to be shown in the bottle lamb class. No shearing is allowed on the fair grounds during fair.
9. Sexually intact sheep departing from the flock of origin to attend fair must be ear-tagged with the official scrapie program tag from the farm of origin.
10. Judging will be based on:
 - a. Participant interview: what the exhibitor has learned about the care and raising of the lamb.
 - b. Cleanliness and overall appearance with the emphasis on what the exhibitor has learned.
 - c. General health, condition and management of the lamb and the young person's knowledge in this area.
 - d. Showmanship: will be asked to set the lamb up, will be asked to walk the lamb around the show ring, be able to tie the lamb to a post, ability to keep lamb between themselves and the judge.
11. Supporting information and photo will be allowed, but not necessary
12. Bottle lambs will **NOT** be sold at the 4-H auction

Awards:

All youth in the bottle lamb open class will received a participation ribbon along with a new lamb halter. An over-all call winner and a 2nd over-all class winner will be awards trophies.
